Licenses

The 50-50 Foundation is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission (ACNC). We are an income exempt charitable institution and we comply with strict audit and regulatory requirements by the Australian Taxation Office.

50-50 Foundation is limited by guarantee as trustee for a charitable trust. The trustee of the charitable trust is 50-50 Foundation Limited, a not-for-profit company limited by guarantee established for the purpose of acting as the trustee of the Foundation. The trustee must comply with the law in relation to trusts in Queensland and the Directors of the trustee are required to comply with the fiduciary duties imposed by the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth). The beneficiaries of the trust are charities.
